Earth is moving for entertainment complex

The long-awaited entertainment complex is on schedule, according to Luna County officials. Alamogordo-based White Sands Construction began work on the complex in March. Cement is being poured and workers are forming what will become a six-screen movie theater and 16-lane bowling alley loaded with enough bells and whistles to make any technology buff jealous.

According to County Manager Scott Vinson, construction is on schedule and due for completion to

allow an early December opening.

“We’d be real optimistic for Thanksgiving, but we’re shooting for the end of the year... December,” said Vinson. “It’s on schedule and the only

downtime has been a couple of weather-related days, other than that the project is progressing and going full speed ahead.”

An initial county investment of 1.2 million has been put toward funds to get construction going and keep it up. American Family Entertainment Centers, based in Pinedale, Wyo., is also charged with financing construction.

“The 1.2 million that the county put up for initiating construction was actually a loan to White Sands Construction.”
